

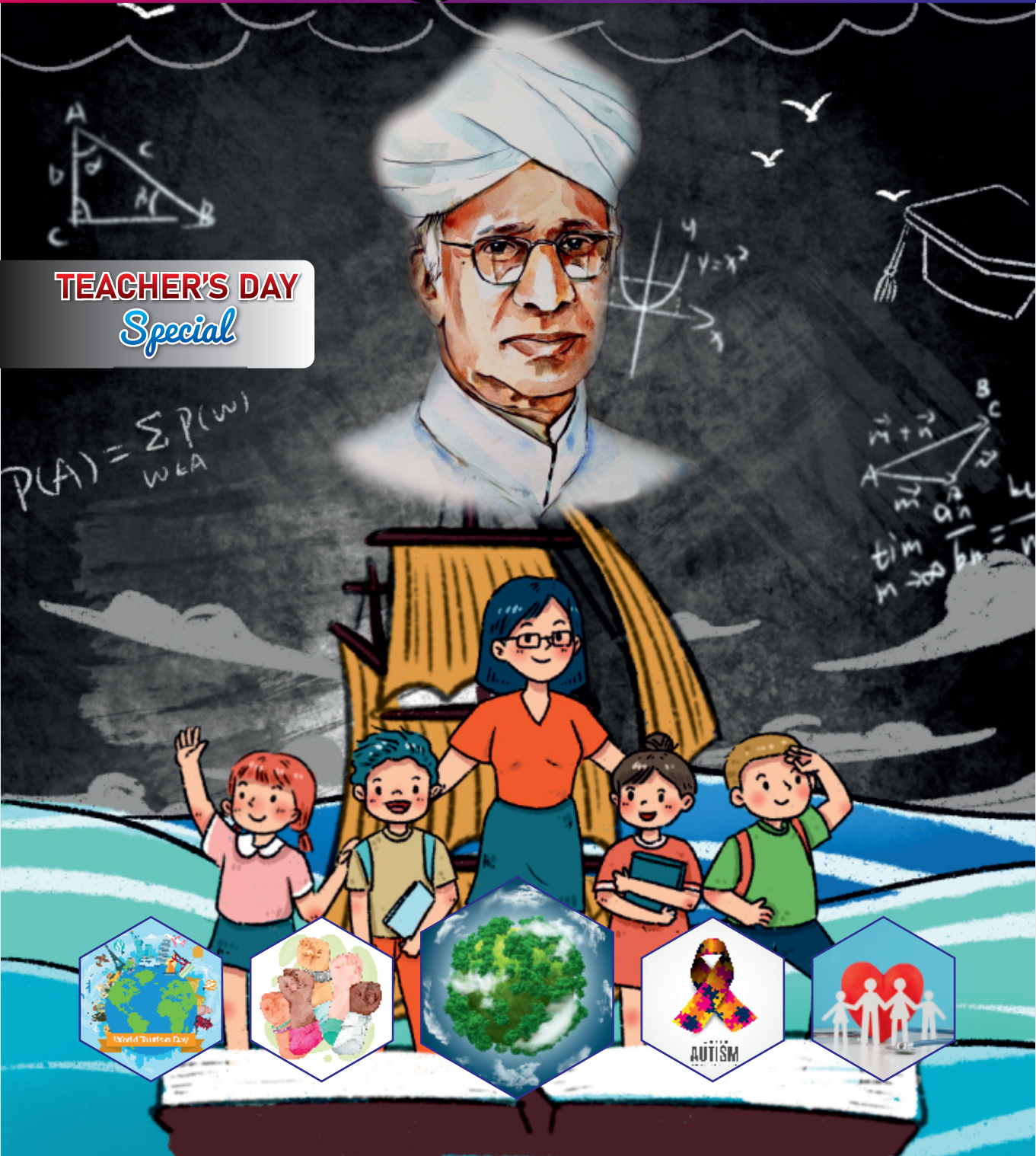

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A Sweet Tribute to Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan

Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan's interest in philosophy is highlighted in this article. He was chosen by the University of Mysore to serve as Professor of Philosophy in 1918. Radhakrishnan was proposed in 1921 for the position of Philosophy Professor at Calcutta University. The publication of Dr. Radhakrishnan's book "Indian Philosophy" took place in 1923. The work was praised as "a literary masterpiece and a philosophical classic." He wrote several volumes on philosophy, including The Bhagavad Gita (1948), The Idealist View of Life (1929), and The Hindu View of Life (1926).

The eminent philosopher and historian Bertrand Russell reportedly remarked that the "highest honor" for philosophy would be if Radhakrishnan were elected president of India. He also became familiar with the philosophical systems of Buddhism, Jainism, and Western philosophers including Plato, Plotinus, Kant, Bradley, and Bergson. He promoted India's demand for independence by using his philosophical lectures as a platform and thus placed Indian philosophy on a global scale.

In this light, as I remember him on this day, I would like to discuss the teachings on Universal Love found in the 'Bhagavad Gita'. The Gita's Chapters 7-12 provide a thorough explanation of the 'Way of Love' and the 'Bhakti Yoga' - the path of devotion.

On the path of bhakti yoga, help is proffered and spirits are healed through love—through the soul's love for that which is eternal, and through the



love of the eternal for each soul.

The Bhakti Yoga path develops naturally. Some people find it appealing because they are drawn to God inherently. Others' gratitude for yoga develops into love and reverence for a teacher, a method of practice, or the cosmos. When we love someone, we want to be close to them so that we may share compliments, and experiences instead feel their affection. We provide comfort during times of illness and inspiration through trying times out of love. We never damage or harm those we care about. Love binds us together.

Giving, receiving, sharing, and uniting are love's ways.

What is it about love that can change you so drastically? Such a question has no solution. It's just in the essence of love. They are blooms that appear everywhere when love develops.

To sum up, the above is the route which is enlightening people's hearts. Because of this, we humans have love for one another and achieve our goals for being here on this beautiful planet by giving, receiving, sharing, and uniting together.

Preference Leads Understanding

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Knowing from known Episode - 1

Malini, Prabhu, and Kandha are good friends as well as teachers. They are discussing about their experiences in their teachings. All of them put a lead of talk on Understanding.

Malini says, as a primary school teacher, I feel my students are more creative, and their Understanding is out of their creativity.

Prabhu says, My higher class students understand from their knowledge what they gain so far.

Kandha gets his chance and says my college students are analysing their knowledge with their unknown to make a better understanding. These teachers intuit that all these words have some value. They plan to make a relevant study on it. Prabhu gives an idea to select a movie and lets the students talk about their understanding of it. All three agree to it and select Ponnien Selvan Part I & II.

Ponnien Selvan Part I & Ponnien Selvan Part II are movies that are liked by all age groups. Moreover, it mingles with all types of elements of entertainment and technologies. Here, the teachers wish to know the difference between the Understanding a film which is based on the observation. It is to test the mentality of the age group on seeing or observing the things that are watched in a movie.

Every person has their own interest in seeing a movie. It is like a test on seeing a picture puzzle. The psychological experts used to make psychological illusions to understand the mind of the people. These illusions are created to make a self-study of the people themselves. Now, there may be a question about the link between these illusions and watching a movie, or there may be doubt about the link between a teacher and a psychologist.

There is a link between the teachers and psychologists. Sometimes, the teachers act as

psychologists to have a better understanding of their students and to guide them to learn better. Let's come to the content: What do the teachers do with their decision? They take one week time to make their observation. They decide to meet on the next Sunday. That day also comes.

When they have a chance to see those, they are excited and involve themselves in it. They prefer outside of what they see, which raises a curiosity among them to be involved more.

Now, as a high school teacher, Prabhu states that his students are very interested in knowing more about the Chola Dynasty, which they studied earlier. They raised lots of questions about the kings and their ministry and their heirs, too. They are eager to know about the region of the Chola Dynasty. They are putting the timeline of the Chola Dynasty and discussing among these and differentiating Chara and Pandiya. On the other hand, another set of students is talking about the costumes and the language that is used in the movies. They find the differences between each and every one of these. It makes a shock in Prabhu because he didn't think this much. The students added the difference in the background of the scenes. They asked Prabhu to take them to those places for a visit. Some, with the help of

technology, read more and give many exciting news in the class. Here, the learners' preferences differ. The learners who have an interest in knowing the Chola Dynasty prefer to know about Tamil History. They are exploring this. The second type of students who have an interest in costumes and languages are exploring their knowledge of the culture of ancient Tamilians. The third category, who talk about the background of the scenes, is willing to explore their geographical travel, so they are requesting their teacher to arrange a visit to these places. The observations of Malini and Prabhu make Kandha happy.

Kandha eagerly notes that his students are more advanced than the higher-grade students. He conveys that they are talking about the amount invested in the film productions, the team behind it, and the technology. They are talking about the selection of artists also. They are talking about the historical places related to the story. They are trying to identify the real history and story. They are analysing the film from various angles. It is a higher level of geographical and historical exploration. Collecting matters regarding these films from various sources shows the preference for the criticism of the films. Thus, Kandha ends his observations as the college students are not satisfied with the things that they are watching or seeing. They wish to analyze the

truth behind it and realize the methodology and technology that play a vital role in those films. The people who wish to know about investments for the future or to develop an understanding of investments by talking about the amount and comparing the production cost of the two films. Their preferences for the films differ from the other two categories. After their conversation, they make a little laugh and calm for a while.

Malini, Prabhu, and Kandha accept one thing: these three-level students watch the same movies. According to their age level and their preferences, their need differs. Due to the different needs, the Understanding differs. Preference and known knowledge lead to proper Understanding.

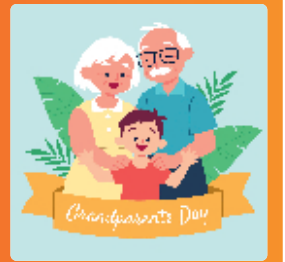
10 World Suicide Prevention Day (WSPD)

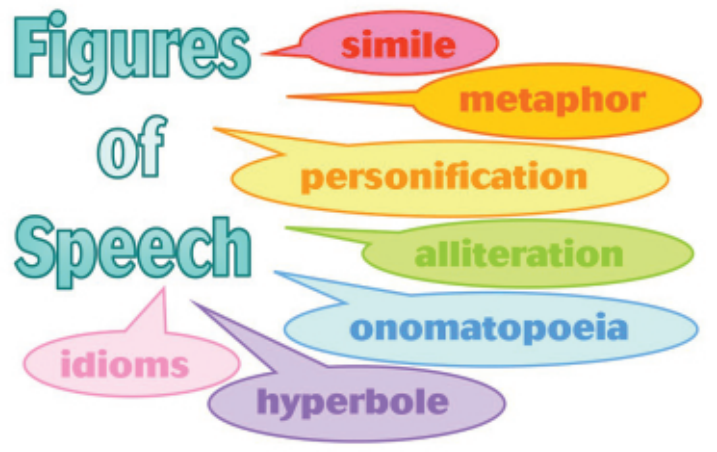

ASTRONOMY

One of the oldest natural sciences is astronomy. The night sky was meticulously observed by early civilizations in recorded history. Babylonians, Greeks, Indians, Egyptians, Chinese, Maya, and many more ancient indigenous peoples of the Americas are among them. Observational and theoretical astronomy are the two fields of professional astronomy. Astronomy is a broad science that encompasses a number of sub-fields centred on the study of various aspects of the universe

Astronomers have increasingly been able to obtain information in different parts of the 7electromagnetic spectrum in addition to examining the universe in the optical spectrum. Divisions of observational astronomy is based on the region of the electromagnetic spectrum observed. Optical astronomy is the branch of astronomy that studies light from near-infrared to nearultraviolet wavelengths using optical instruments (mirrors, lenses, and solid-state detectors).

In the middle of this spectrum is visible-light astronomy, which uses wavelengths measurable by the human eye (about 400-700 nm). Infrared astronomy is concerned with the detection and analysis of infrared radiation with wavelengths greater than the detection limit of silicon solid-state detectors, which is roughly 1 m. The most popular equipment is a reflecting telescope equipped with an infrared-sensitive

detector. At some wavelengths, when the atmosphere is opaque, or to minimise noise caused by thermal radiation from the atmosphere, space telescopes are used.

Radio astronomy detects radiation with wavelengths ranging from millimetres to decametres.

The receivers are comparable to those used in radio broadcasting, but they are far more sensitive. Radio astronomy has continued to advance, even employing radio astronomy satellites to create interferometers with baselines considerably greater than the Earth's High-energy astronomy includes X-ray astronomy, Gamma-Ray astronomy, and Extreme UV astronomy. High energy astronomy is the study of 8astronomical objects that release electromagnetic radiation of highly energetic wavelengths. Occultation astronomy is the observation of one celestial object occults or eclipses another. An occultation is a term used in astronomy to describe when one object is obscured by another object passing between it and the observer.
